High Demand Occupations – Exemption from employability requirement Some occupations are designated as "High Demand" in the list below. Applicants for nomination under the 'Overseas Applicant Category (3A)' for the Skilled Work Regional (Provisional) visa (subclass 491) do not need to provide employability research and evidence if they meet the experience, English requirements and any other items specified for that occupation.


